Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

The apostles ask Jesus, "Increase our faith." He replies, "Were your faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." The disciples are asking for a quantitative increase in faith, Jesus' example tells them of the quality of faith. Faith is not a collection of good deeds, but a quality of courage and love. The parable that Jesus then tells seems harsh. "The servant comes in from a long day of manual labour, "and the master says, 'Get my supper laid, make yourself tidy and wait on me, while Leat and drink You can eat and drink yourself after

make yourself tidy and wait on me, while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards.' Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So, with you, when you have done all you have been told to do, say, we are merely servants we have done no more than our duty." Jesus' parable warns against defining religion merely in terms of doing what we are told. Just a little bit of faith (like a mustard seed) can produce astonishing results, while doing just what you are told to do brings little benefit. Such faith involves keeping alive the vision of justice and peace for all.

Injustice in Palestine



As in all human conflicts, there are wrongs and rights on both sides in the conflict between Israel and Palestine. Our Christian response in these situations is to pray for and to call for Peace and to aid the suffering, where we can. It is also our duty to point out and raise awareness when we can see a clear injustice taking place.

Such is the case of Mohammed El Halabi, the Palestinian director of the charity World Vision International (WVI). After a 6-year trial (largely held in secret) Halabi has been sentenced by an Israeli court to a further 6 years in prison (so 12 in total). Halabi was arrested in 2016 and accused of channelling aid funds to Hamas, considered by Israel as a terrorist group.

After thorough investigations by the UN, WVI, independent world class auditors and the Australian government, no evidence of wrongdoing was found. WVI said the unjust verdict and sentence serve to hinder aid to Palestinian people and humanitarian work on their behalf. This appears to be the intent of the Israeli authorities. This is not just. Please pray for Halabi and others suffering from grave injustices.
