

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Today's gospel begins with a vivid contrast between rich and poor: a rich man dressed in purple and fine linen who feasts magnificently every day and a poor man at his gate, covered in ulcerous sores, longing for the scraps from the table with dogs as his only companions who lick his sores.

The poor man dies and is carried by the angels to the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man dies, is buried and ends up in torment in Hades (the underworld, hell). He looks up and sees Abraham a long way off and begs him to send Lazarus with a drop of water to cool his tongue in his agony in the flames. Abraham points out that in his lifetime the rich man's wealth made him blind to Lazarus's suffering and now it is too late to make amends.

Having realized the extent of his sin, the rich man begs Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers. Abraham replies that they have the same opportunities that he had to follow God's law and care for the poor and needy and the warnings of Moses and the prophets.



Injustice in Palestine

As in all human conflicts, there are wrongs and rights on both sides in the conflict between Israel and Palestine. Our Christian response in these situations is to pray for and to call for Peace and to aid the suffering, where we can. It is also our duty to point out and raise awareness when we can see a clear injustice taking place.

Such is the case of Mohammed El Halabi, the Palestinian director of the charity World Vision International (WVI). After a 6-year trial (largely held in secret) Halabi has been sentenced by an Israeli court to a further 6 years in prison (so 12 in total). Halabi was arrested in 2016 and accused of channelling aid funds to Hamas, considered by Israel as a terrorist group.

After thorough investigations by the UN, WVI, independent world class auditors and the Australian government, no evidence of wrongdoing was found. WVI said the unjust verdict and sentence serve to hinder aid to Palestinian people and humanitarian work on their behalf. This appears to be the intent of the Israeli authorities. This is not just.

Please pray for Halabi and others suffering from grave injustices.
