
Cecilia Maureen Jones' Funeral Mass will be held at Our Lady & St John on Tuesday 3rd January at 11:00 am.

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Matthew and Luke both proclaim in story form the Christmas message that God's eternal Word has taken on human flesh. Matthew begins with a family tree tracing Jesus' origins through saints and sinners and a series of extraordinary births showing the triumph of God's grace. Jesus is born into a world of homelessness and violence. A wondrous parade of people in Luke's gospel are touched by Jesus' coming: an elderly priest and his childless wife; a young woman called to bring forth a child in a way unheard of in human history. The dark night is lit up with God's glory and the shepherds hearing news of

great joy. An elderly couple live in the temple and wait for the coming of God's Anointed. While in Matthew an anointed Jewish king turns out to be a brutal killer, wise men from the east follow a star to kneel before the child and his mother. Jesus begins his life as an exile from land and people and eventually returns to grow up in an obscure village. The Christmas stories affirm our humanity in all its glory and brokenness. They are retold not just at Christmas but in the lives of countless people in whom God's Word continues to become flesh and dwell amongst us. As we celebrate the joy of Christmas let us also remember in prayer the victims of violence and tragic accidents.



St Francis' Corner

Br. Thomas of Celano, a contemporary biographer of St. Francis writes:

"The birthday of the Child Jesus, Francis observed with inexpressible eagerness over all other feasts, saying that it was the feast of feasts, on which God, having become a tiny infant, clung to human breasts.

---the time of great rejoicing came. Men and women of that neighbourhood prepared with glad hearts, according to their means, candles and torches to light up that night --- At length the saint of

God came, and finding all things prepared (The Nativity scene), *he saw it and was glad* (Jn. 8-56) ---- Greccio was made as it were a new Bethlehem. The night was lighted up like the day, and it delighted men and beasts. The people came and were filled with a new joy over the new mystery, and the whole night resounded with their rejoicing. The saint of God stood before the manger, uttering sighs, overcome with love, and filled with a wonderful happiness."
