



Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

In today's gospel reading Jesus tells his disciples that they are the light of the world. In a modern town or city, where technology can turn light into day, the contrast between light and darkness loses its force. In Jesus' time darkness came suddenly, enveloping the

whole land. Only from the light on a lampstand would the faces of other people become visible. Light was a beacon to guide a travel-weary pilgrim; its faint glimmer signalled the beginning of a new day. Jesus also declares that his disciples are the salt of the earth. In the ancient world salt was very precious and used to flavour and preserve food. Though technically salt (sodium chloride) can never totally lose its flavour, it can become adulterated and weakened. Jesus' image is simultaneously challenging and frightening. Disciples are like salt necessary for life, and the call once given cannot be revoked, just as salt can never totally lose its flavour. But if the disciples abuse the call and grace of God, "they are good for nothing and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men." We are all called to become salt of the earth and beacons of hope for others.

St Francis' Corner

How St. Francis lived before his conversion.

Br. Thomas of Celano, Francis' biographer, writes of him:-

These are the wretched circumstances among which the man whom we venerate today as a saint, for he truly is a saint, lived in his youth, and almost up to the twenty fifth year of his age. He squandered and wasted his time miserably. Indeed he outdid all his contemporaries in vanities - - - On the other hand he was a very kindly person, easy and affable, even making himself foolish because of it; (He continues-) The hand of the Lord, therefore, came upon him. (Ezech 1, 3.) and a change was wrought by the right hand of the Most High that through him an assurance might be granted to sinners that they had been restored to grace, and that he might become an example to all of conversion to God. St. Francis writes in his Letter to all the Faithful - It is the Father's will that we should all be saved by the Son, and that we should receive him with a pure heart and chaste body.
