## **Reflection on the Sunday Gospel**

Jesus tired by the journey he has made sits straight down by Jacob's well, a place that is sacred to both Jews and Samaritans. A woman comes alone to draw water. Jesus surprises her by asking her for a drink. Jews do not associate with Samaritans. Jesus goes on to say that if she only knew

what God is offering and who he is, she would be thirsting for living water. Living water means both fresh, flowing water and water that gives life. Those who drink this water will never thirst and will enjoy eternal life. She asks for this water, so she won't have to keep coming to the well. But she is really asking for something deeper. Jesus then asks her to bring her husband. When she says she has none, he says quite bluntly that she is correct because although she has had five, the one she is with now is not really her husband. That is why she is not popular with other women and has come alone to the well. She changes the subject by making an act of faith, "I see you are a prophet, Sir." From being a seeker, she becomes a missionary and leads many others to faith in Jesus not just as a prophet but as the Saviour of the World.

## Lent Actions 2023 - Fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

Ideas to care for creation during Lent and to live more sustainably.

### How about making a pledge for prayer in Lent?

Go to Stations of the Cross : following Mass or Service of Word and Communion on Monday and Tuesday each week at Our Lady and St John and following Mass on Saturday at Holy Family

Walk and pray in solidarity with the poor on the <u>CAFOD Big Lent Walk</u>

#### How about a Fast from Buying?

Buy less, buy second hand from charity shops. Re-use, recycle, donate to charity shops. Buy Fairtrade where possible.

#### Or a Fast from Energy

Turn down thermostats on heating. Cook in larger batches for future meals. Change to LED light bulbs. Measure your Carbon footprint and make your own fast <u>WWF Footprint Calculator</u>

#### A Fast from Transport

Have a car free day each week/walk or cycle more/use public transport. Combine tasks that require car use. Share lifts. If you stop for more than 10 seconds, switch your car engine off. *Stop Idling* 

#### A Fast from Plastic

Avoid single use plastic.

Use re-useable cups.

Use a refill shop to refill with cleaning products, hygiene products etc.

Try clothes washing sheets or climate friendly laundry products.

#### A Fast from Waste

Plan at least one meat free meal each week.

Plan meals, shop for what you need.

Recycle well: take Blister packs (from tablets) at <u>Superdrug</u>, used <u>postage stamps</u> and used batteries to supermarkets or the tip.




#### TURKEY-SYRIA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL

On 6th February, a 7.9 magnitude earthquake has struck north-west Syria and Turkey. The death toll has surpassed 21,000 and continues to climb.

Following last week's earthquake in Turkey and Syria, many of you have been asking and looking for ways to help the thousands left injured and without shelter in the freezing winter weather. Both

CAFOD and Cartias have launched appeals to provide urgent food, water and shelter to survivors.





"We are dealing with deaths that are going over 21,000 people already and I think what we're getting from the Caritas teams is that this is only a small snapshot of what's happening.
