

# **Reflection on the Sunday Gospel**

In today's First Reading God is so important to the prophet Jeremiah that he experiences a fire in his belly that he must tell people about even though he suffers ridicule. Then Jesus asks in the gospel today: 'What's the point of possessing the whole world, money, riches, status, power, if it

means that you never enjoy the real purpose of life?' He reminds us that the only way to enjoy life to the full is to renounce self, to put aside selfish interest, in order to follow him. In other words, if we let anything get between us and God then we become cut off from what can really satisfy our needs. One of the lines of today's Responsorial Psalm, psalm 62 is quite extraordinary. It simply says, 'Your love is better than life.' Better than life? The psalmist is saying that if our life is not centred on what is really important then it's not worth having. If we have found God then we realise that our lives are very short indeed yet the only thing that ultimately matters is that we possess God for eternity. No matter how wealthy, how lucky people appear to others, they will always wander in a dry desert until the moment they discover the living spring that is God.

### Season of Creation

This weekend marks the start of the Season of Creation which runs from 1st September (World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and runs until 4<sup>th</sup> October (the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi) each year.



This ecumenical season is dedicated to prayer and action for the protection of creation. It is a time to renew our relationships with God our Creator, and with all creation, as we join together in prayer with Christians across the world. We give thanks for all that God has made, repent for the damage that we have caused and commit ourselves to take action to protect the earth our common home.



"Let Justice and Peace Flow" is the theme and invitation of this year's Season of Creation. In his message for the World Day of Prayer for Creation 2023, Pope Francis encourages us to "live, work and pray that our common home will teem with life once again." A full copy of Pope Francis' message is enclosed with this Newsletter and is also available at the back of church.

Prophet Amos cries out: "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5: 24) and so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity. As the people of God, we must work together on behalf of all Creation, as part of that mighty river of peace and justice.

Next week we will give details of how we will be participating in the Season of Creation at Our Lady & St.John.

Meanwhile, you are warmly invited to join Christians across Wirral on a Pilgrimage for the Planet organised by Christian Climate Action, Faiths4Change, Friends of Port Sunlight River Park and local groups on Saturday 9th September at 10.30-12.30 in Port Sunlight River Park. It is a 3km walk that will look at the use of this reclaimed land from its construction by Lever's, through use as landfill, to the creation of this biodiverse green space, focusing on how we have shaped the landscape and how can we take responsibility for our waste.


# **Justice and Peace Group**
