

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Jesus tells us today that the whole Law and the Prophets depend on the commandments to love God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind and to love your neighbour as yourself. Today's readings prepare for the celebrations of All Saints and All Souls, which herald those who truly loved God and neighbour. A command to love God can seem puzzling, for if love is spontaneous and free how can it be commanded? God does not really need our service, nor is God changed by love as is a neighbour or a loved one. God is also absolute mystery and it is difficult to really love what we do not know. Often we collapse the command to love God into service of neighbour. We are more at ease speaking of following God's will, serving God, or praying to God in hope and faith. Deep human love for another offers an image of the love of God. I have observed people after many years of marriage content to sit quietly in each other's presence. Behind this silent presence lies decades of knowledge, care and trials borne together. It is also an act of gratitude for years of commitment to each other. Love of God is like this. Often it is best expressed in simply sitting and quietly realising how God has been a partner with us in the whole of our lives.

For a synodal Church The Synod spokesman,

Paola Ruffini, called a

reporter's assertion that there will be no concrete result at the end of the synod "inexact and false", saying the result will be a synthesis document which will be voted on and approved, and sent back to local parishes and dioceses to evaluate and discuss further before next October's synod gathering.

"To say that it's a round table as if it's a talk show is exactly the opposite of what I said," he said, insisting, "It's a conversation in the spirit which is trying to make a discernment precisely in order to respond to what was requested by the People of God."
