Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Today Jesus tells the story of the five foolish and five sensible bridesmaids. These will wait and welcome the bride and bridegroom to their new home with festive lamps to light the way. Since the couple's arrival is

delayed until midnight, the young women fall asleep only to be wakened by a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him!" They all wake up and relight their lamps, while the foolish ones who brought no oil ask the others to share their oil, only to be met with the harsh reply, "No. There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to the sellers to buy some for yourselves." This is at midnight when all the shops are closed. The foolish ones go off to seek oil. We never know whether they found any, but when they return the feast has started and the door is barred. They call out, "Lord, Lord! Open the door for us." But the groom replies, "I tell you solemnly I do not know you The lamps lit and supplied with oil are symbols of the works of love and mercy on which we will all be judged." So stay awake and be prepared because you do not know either the day or the hour when Jesus will come.




Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with Adoration

Salina is the small-scale farmer from Bangladesh who is calling on the World Bank to protect the rights of farmers over their own seeds. 70,000 parishioners in England and Wales signed the letter, and a third of all parishes took part. Salina said, "I am very happy to know about 70,000 signatures along with mine." This helped CAFOD to secure initial meetings with World Bank staff, who heard the message that seeds are for all. This is a long struggle but it's a very good start. Thank you for adding your voice.
