Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

John the Baptist's location in the desert, the barren wilderness southeast of Jerusalem near the Dead Sea, recalls the years of wilderness wandering of God's people between the Exodus and entry into the promised Land, and the place of the covenant at Sinai. The wilderness is seen positively as the place of God's saving acts and negatively as the site of testing and rebellion. Jesus is tested there, retreats there to pray and to avoid crowds, feeds the people there. His final test comes when he is "deserted" by his followers and accepts the chalice of suffering.

Today John summons the people to a baptism of repentance, a symbolic washing that signifies a new way of thinking. "Repentance," with its overtones of sorrow, contrition and a firm purpose of amendment, disguises the rich meaning of the Greek term *metanoia*, which rather suggests a second look, taking stock, recollection and renewal. Such repentance leads to forgiveness of sin, release from captivity and cancellation of punishment. Jesus himself will leave the desert to begin his ministry by joining a call for *metanoia* to the joyful proclamation of the Good News and the closeness of God's reign. Let us stand in the desert among the crowds and listen to John's words to think again, take stock and prepare the way of the Lord.

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Please join us at 9am for Holy Mass followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Virgin of Guadalupe refers to the Virgin Mary when she appeared to a man named Juan Diego in Mexico in 1531. She holds a special place in the culture and religious life of Mexico. The pagan Indians recognised by Mary's dress that she was a pregnant virgin and that she came from Heaven, of noble birth but was not God. As a result, 9 million Indians became Christians in a matter of about 3 years.

Mary gives a message of love and compassion. She said "Do I not care for you? Am I not your Mother?" Ours too. Please come and thank Jesus for the gift to us of His Blessed Mother.
