# **Reflection on the Sunday Gospel**

#### By Father Stephen

Today we have Mark's account of the temptation of Jesus. The term "temptation" is inaccurate, since the original Greek means "tested" or "subjected to a trial." This evokes the wider theme of God's testing of the people of Israel, like Jesus in the wilderness, the suffering servant of Isaiah and the suffering just person of the Book of Wisdom who, though tested by God remains faithful and is called a child of God. In this first Lenten Sunday gospel the Church portrays a Jesus who

"because he himself was tested through what he suffered is able to help those who are being tested." Jesus leaves the wilderness to proclaim the Good News from God. The news is good because the kingdom of God, God's reign is at hand. God is a king who protects an endangered people, has special concern for the vulnerable and judges violence and injustice. Only by following the way of Jesus through the Gospel, hearing his word and adopting his values can we understand more deeply the mystery of God's reign. The beginning of this journey through Lent calls for repentance or a second look at life and belief, an act of trust in God who guides the unfolding journey.


## Make me a channel of your peace

We must first pray to receive Peace ourselves before we can share Peace with others. Lent is a wonderful opportunity for receiving or returning to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We can channel the Peace we receive to others by neither initiating hatred nor joining in the hatred of others. Often we are invited to join in hatred on one side or the other. Dare you take the risk of suggesting that there may be a misunderstanding or a middle way? Is now the time for you to take that first step to heal a broken relationship?

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love, Where there is injury, pardon Where there is doubt, faith, Where there is despair, hope, Where there is darkness, light, Where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, not so much to be understood as to understand, not so much to be loved, as to love; for it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, it is in dying that we awake to eternal life.
