Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Today's gospel from John depicts the call and response of Jesus' first followers as part of a series of initial revelations of Jesus that culminate at the wedding feast of Cana where Jesus "let his glory be seen and his disciples believed in him." John the Baptist is the witness who points out Jesus as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world," evoking the Suffering Servant of Isaiah and the sacrifice of the Paschal Lamb. The two disciples follow Jesus, but, unlike in Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus asks, "What do you want?" They answer "Rabbi" –which means Teacher – "Where do you live?" Jesus invites them to come and see and they stay with him for the rest of the day. The following day Andrew finds his brother Simon and tells him, "We have found the Messiah" –which means the Christ or Anointed One- and takes Simon to Jesus who gives him the name Cephas (meaning Peter or Rock).

This narrative is a "coming to faith" story not only for John's original hearers or readers, but for Christians today. The questions and commands highlight the process, "What do you want?", "Where do you live?", "Come and see." People come to Jesus on the testimony of others. Jesus enters their lives as a response to their deepest longing, and only after "staying" with him can they confess him as "Christ."



A NEW WAY TO PAY!

How many times have you come to church and realised that you 🛧 don't have any cash with you for the Sunday collection or a retiring collection?

You may have noticed a new addition to the back of Our Lady and St John's church by the main doors in the porch. We have decided following on from trials in other Diocesan Parish Churches, to install a Digital Donation Plate. This will allow our parishioners to pay for things without the need of cash. It is simple and quick to use.

Tap on the screen of the tablet to bring it to life.

Tap on the amount you wish to donate or select the Other Amount button to enter you own amount in.

Once you have selected the amount, tap your card ☆ on the top of the pin pad to the righthand side of the tablet (or insert you card into the reader at the top). Your card will only be debited for the exact money you select.

If you are a UK taxpayer, you will have the option to Gift Aid your donation. Simply enter your name, house number, postcode and email address and it will automatically register your donation for Gift Aid

Please be reassurred that this is NOT replacing the usual collection plates or the ability to put cash into the wall safes for candles, Saint Anthony or the piety stall, but rather a helpful alternative .
