Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Today's gospel begins with John asking how to silence someone who is not one of us casting out devils or demons in Jesus' name. Jesus says, 'You must not stop him... Anyone who is not against us is for us.' Then Jesus adds: 'Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ will surely not lose his reward.' Jesus goes on to say that

if anyone causes a young or vulnerable person to fall or puts an obstacle in their way, the consequences are so grave that it is better to be thrown into the sea with a great millstone round your neck or enter life without limbs or organs than harm a young person, and be thrown whole into hell. So today's readings are both good and bad news. The good news is that those who do the work of Jesus, even without being his followers are 'for him.' The bad is that affluent people sometimes not only resent the physical presence of children but also the benefits given to families with children. And yet children not only have a special place in Jesus' heart but will provide a future for us all. So it is distressing that so many children underachieve in school and suffer poverty and poor health.

ASSISTED SUICIDE - Should the law be changed?

You are invited to a lecture on the issue of assisted suicide. The Prime Minister has pledged to have a vote on assisted suicide and Lord Falconer has already tabled a Private Members' Bill in the House of Lords.

This lecture will be held at the Mercure Manchester Piccadilly Hotel, Portland Street, Manchester M1 4PH from 7:30pm - 9pm on **Tuesday 22nd October** and the speaker, Dr Dominic Whitehouse, who is a palliative care consultant currently working in a hospice in Sussex, will be explaining why a change in the law would be harmful to patients, doctors and to society.
