Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

The gospel begins with the Pharisees testing Jesus by asking whether it is against the law for a man to divorce his wife. Jesus responds by asking them about the Law and they quote Deuteronomy 4:1 which allows a man to divorce his wife by simply drawing up a writ of dismissal. Jesus responds by quoting two texts from the creation accounts of Genesis: "male and female he created them' and "the two of them become one flesh." These texts attribute two essential qualities to marriage: unity and complementarity. Neither man nor woman alone embodies the fullness of God's design, but man and woman in union mirror the mystery of God. While Jesus presents a vision of what marriage should be, he utters no word of condemnation of the divorced and the Gospel of John shows Jesus defending a woman about to be stoned for adultery and giving a special mission to an often-married woman, the Samaritan woman he meets at the well. Jesus then welcomes children to him and says they represent both non-domination and the need for care that should characterise our relationships. Jesus then puts his arms round the children and blesses them, an enduring image that should haunt our consciences as we see the horrors of malnourished and diseased children both at home and abroad.

ASSISTED SUICIDE - Should the law be changed?

You are invited to a lecture on the issue of assisted suicide. The Prime Minister has pledged to have a vote on assisted suicide and Lord Falconer has already tabled a Private Members' Bill in the House of Lords.

This lecture will be held at the Mercure Manchester Piccadilly Hotel, Portland Street, Manchester M1 4PH from 7:30pm - 9pm on **Tuesday 22nd October** and the speaker, Dr Dominic Whitehouse, who is a palliative care consultant currently working in a hospice in Sussex, will be explaining why a change in the law would be harmful to patients, doctors and to society.




