### **Reflection on the Sunday Gospel**

In today's gospel a young man runs up eager to inherit eternal life. Jesus asks him how well he knows and applies the commandments. The man replies that he has kept them all from his earliest

days. Jesus looks steadily at him, loves him and says: "Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor... then come, follow me." The man's face falls at this and he goes away sad, for he is very wealthy. Jesus says, "How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the Kingdom of God." The disciples themselves seek power and prestige, so they are astounded, since they regard riches as a sign of God's favour. But Jesus insists: "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." More astonished than ever the disciples say: "In that case who can be saved?" Jesus gazes at them: "For men it is impossible, but not for God, because everything is possible for God."The gospel is challenging for us following Jesus today. We have hardly got rid of our possessions. The Church also depends on the generosity of people with money






### **RNIB Used Stamps**


Please donate any stamps to the Royal National Institute for the Blind. There is a collection box at the back of Our Lady and St John.



# Blessed Carlo Acutis - Feast Day 12th October 'The first millennium saint'

The Life of Carlo Acutis

Carlo Acutis was born in London on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1991 to Italian parents and moved to Milan when he was a few months old. As a child, Carlo was devoted to the Mother of God and prayed the Rosary daily.

He was an Italian website designer who documented Eucharistic miracles and approved Marian apparitions and catalogued both on a website he designed before his death from leukaemia on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2006. Acutis was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills and devotion to the Eucharist which became a core theme of his life. He was beatified by Pope Francis on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2020 and in 2024 his canonization was approved. The date for his canonization has yet to be announced.

Because of his interest in computers and his miracles website, Acutis was popularly called "the patron saint of the Internet" once his cause for sainthood was underway.

He has also been dubbed "the first millennial saint," because he is the first person of the millennial generation to have become a candidate for sainthood.

Carlo's journey to become a saint.... His first miracle was attributed to him in early 2020, in response to a Brazilian boy born with a malformed pancreas having been healed after praying to Acutis for his intercession and receiving one of his relics.

The second miracle involved the healing of a young woman, 21, from Costa Rica, studying in Florence, Italy, who fell from her bicycle in July 2022. She had incurred a severe head injury.
