#### **Reflection on the Sunday Gospel**

Today's gospel has James and John seeking positions of power and arousing jealousy among the other disciples, leading Jesus to adopt the role of Isaiah's suffering servant, "the Son of Man, who has come not to be served but serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

We share in Christ's priesthood. Whether we exercise the priesthood of the

baptized or the ordained priesthood, it is to be a priesthood of service in a servant Church. The service is not just about being available but a service that actively brings liberation to people. A ransom is the price paid to free someone from slavery which can involve substituting yourself for the slave.

What God has done for us does call for a response of gratitude and loving service. Many people in authority or positions of responsibility throw their weight around, but Jesus states categorically: "This is not to happen among you!"

Loving service is displayed in parents at the bedside of a sick child, a spouse caring for another with dementia, giving lifts to people who have no transport, visiting the housebound and so on. How can we all live lives of better service?



#### The Synod Second Session October 2<sup>nd</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> 2024

Pope Francis launched the Synod on Synodality in October 2021. Now, in October 2024, we have reached its final stage

On 1st October, the evening before the Synod opened, the Margaret Beaufort Institute (MBI) organized the webinar: 'The Synod on Synodality, 2024: How Did We Get Here? Where Are We Going?'

The first part provided a broad historical and theological framework to consider the significance and potential of this three-year synodal process. The second part consisted of an open discussion in which participants reflected on their actual experiences of the process. In the first part, Last Stage of The Synod on Synodality, Dr Peter Coughlan delivered a talk that is now accessible on the MBI YouTube Channel. The second part, moderated by Dr Liam Hayes of the Centre for Ecclesial Ethics, featured a lively exchange of views in which participants expressed their concerns and hopes for the coming years.

From what was said, it is evident that participants were very aware that what Pope Francis has been seeking during these three years is not so much to focus on specific aspects of the Church's life and mission but to initiate a process that engages all members of the Church together on a synodal path. His repeated insistence on a wide consultation in the synods held during his pontificate is evidence of this. It is equally clear from the imaginative and creative way in which the present Synod on Synodality has been organized, with its emphasis on honest speaking, careful listening, and above all, prayer, reflection, and discernment, that Pope Francis sees the Holy Spirit as the principal protagonist in the synodal process.

In 2013, his first year as pope, Francis stated in The Joy of the Gospel: "I dream of a missionary option, that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything ... so that everything can be suitably channelled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for its self-preservation." In those words, we find the central focus of Pope Francis' pontificate. Now, eleven years later, he invites the entire Church to remain focused on that same missionary impulse. The challenge he has presented to the current Synod expresses this clearly: "How to be a synodal Church in mission?" This is a question the Church must always keep in mind. It is a permanent and ongoing question, a criterion for everything that the Church, in response to the command of Christ and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, sets out to be and to do.





Fast from whatever you can given your state of health etc, but make sure it is something that involves a sacrifice to yourself.

We are asking people to say a Rosary (or an extra Rosary if you say it daily already).

You could also offer an extra effort such as going to Mass (or an extra Mass) on the day, or going to Adoration. You can even pray before a closed tabernacle if Adoration is not available near you.


And He said to them; This kind (of demon) can go out by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. (Gospel of Mark 9:29)
