Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

As the new liturgical year begins, the First Sunday of Advent reminds us that our lives are caught up in a cosmic drama and that history will end with the return of Christ and the redemption of humanity. St Luke and St Paul urge that we live not only by looking back to what Christ has done for us, but also by looking forward to

the future. Despite the emphasis throughout this Gospel on the joyful benefits of God made known in Jesus, in this apocalyptic section Luke's Jesus is more concerned about negative behaviour: dissipation, drunkenness, and the cares of this life. Jesus here virtually paraphrases the Lord's Prayer in asking for God's protection in the time of trial: "Stay awake at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man." Paul, who when writing his First Letter to the Thessalonians expected Jesus to return in his lifetime, is more positive. He prays that his community, while waiting, may "abound in love for one another and for all, so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of the Lord with all his saints."

Diocesan Advent Talks

You are invited to a series of talks in Advent to coincide with the launch of the New Lectionary at the Parish Hall, Holy Angels, Hale Barns, Altrincham, WA15 OHG.

On **7pm on Wednesday 4**th **December** we are delighted to welcome Fr Paul Denney who is a priest of the Diocese of Motherwell, Scotland. He has a Licentiate in Scared Scripture from the Pontifical Biblical Institute. He has recently served on the editorial board for the new lectionary as the delegate of the Bishops' Conference of Scotland. He will speak to us about the new translation of the Lectionary that we will be using at Mass.

On **Wednesday 11**th **December** Fr Marco Egawhary a priest pf the Archdiocese of Birmingham, he completed further studies at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome. His talk will be on why it is important to pray with the scriptures and how to pray with them.

Wednesday 18th **December** Fr David Irwin priest of the Diocese of Shrewsbury and Natalie Orefice, Director of Evangelisation and Catechesis for the Diocese of Shrewsbury will present Dei Verbum on Divine Revelation from the Second Vatican Council.

After each talk we will go into the parish church for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Benediction and Compline. All are welcome to attend.
