There will be a retiring collection for the Clergy Education & Training Fund after all Masses this weekend

What is the Clergy Education & Training Fund?

Those seeking to undertake the work of the Church in the Diocese have many training needs. Candidates accepted for priestly formation spend around 6 years at a Seminary. Whilst the time in Seminary helps the student to determine God's will for him, it is also designed to provide experiences so that the student can play a full role in parish community life following Ordination. Training is also undertaken by those men wishing to become Permanent Deacons in Parishes in the Diocese. As in most occupations, learning and education is a life-long process, and Priests and Deacons have ongoing training needs in their ministries. However, training for Seminarians, Deacons and Clergy involves considerable expense, and the Clergy Education & Training Fund seeks to help meet these costs.

Why does the Clergy Education & Training Fund need your help?

At a time of shortages of Priests, it is a blessing that we have men studying for the Priesthood and Diaconate. This is good news for the people of the Diocese, but the training is expensive – for example, it costs around £30,000 a year (about £80 a day) to train a Seminarian, and £4,000 a year to train a Deacon. The Clergy Education & Training Fund helps meet these costs, the ongoing training needs of Clergy, and in certain instances the cost of training Laity (such as Eucharistic Ministers).



Reflection on the Sunday Gospel

Jesus is baptized only after all the other people have been baptized by John and, while Jesus is at prayer, heaven opens and the Holy Spirit descends on him in bodily shape, like a dove, and a voice comes from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Jesus at prayer foreshadows the importance of


prayer throughout the Gospel of Luke. Major events in salvation history occur in the context of prayer, for example the annunciation of John the Baptist's birth to his father, the priest Zechariah, the Transfiguration, the death of Jesus. The major figures of the Gospel are people who proclaim God in prayer: Mary, Zechariah, Simeon and Anna. Only Luke has the parables about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. Jesus' life and ministry arise from prayer inspired by the Holy Spirit, as will the lives and ministries of his followers.

Luke also sees Jesus as the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy of the servant, whom I (the Lord) uphold, my chosen in whom my soul delights." This servant will establish true justice in the earth. "He will establish justice by his teaching. Jesus is appointed as "a covenant for the people and a light of the nations."

As we celebrate 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea, the worship service



has at its heart, the Nicene Creed. Reflecting this, the scripture readings for this year focus on belief. We are invited to reflect on the story of Martha's confession of faith in Jesus as narrated in John 11:17-27. Each is called to sit with Jesus' provocative question to Martha: "Do you believe this?"
